George Orwell (25 June 1903 – 21 January 1950) was an English diarist during the British Empire's rule of India. He is best known for two novels that he wrote in the late 1940s, *Animal Farm* and *Nineteen Eighty-Four*. In those works, he said that totalitarianism, especially Stalinism, was very bad. Orwell fought in the Spanish Civil War with the antifascist troops. These troops were against the dictatorship of fascist governments. Orwell died of tuberculosis in London.

George Orwell was the pen name used by British author and journalist Eric Arthur Blair. During most of his professional life time Orwell was best known for his journalism, both in the British press and in books such as *Homage to Catalonia*, describing his activities during the Spanish Civil War, and *Down and Out in Paris and London*, describing a period of poverty in these cities. Orwell is best remembered today for two of his novels, *Animal Farm* and *Nineteen Eighty-Four*.

Eric Arthur Blair (25 June 1903 – 21 January 1950), better known by his pen name George Orwell, was an English novelist and essayist, journalist and critic, whose work is characterised by lucid prose, awareness of social injustice, opposition to totalitarianism, and outspoken support of democratic socialism. As a writer, Orwell produced literary criticism and poetry, fiction and polemical journalism; and is best known for the allegorical novella *Animal Farm* (1945) and the dystopian novel *Nineteen Eighty-four* (1949), the fictionalized but autobiographical *Down and Out in Paris and London* (1933), and *Homage to Catalonia* (1938), an account of his experiences in the Spanish Civil War. George Orwell was the pseudonym of Eric Arthur Blair, born in Motihari, Bengal, India, in 1903, to a family which he described in *The Road to Wigan Pier* (1937) as "lower-upper middle class": "upper-middle class without money". According to his biographer Bernard Crick, Orwell used a pseudonym "partly to avoid embarrassing his parents, partly as a hedge against failure, and partly because he disliked the name Eric, which reminded him of a prig in a Victorian boys' story".
